## **Delhi Sightseeing**

Morning after breakfast sightseeing tour of Delhi:

The Red Fort, built by Emperor Shah Jahan in the 17th century, symbolizes India's sovereignty and has been designated a World Heritage site by UNESCO in 2007. Raj Ghat, where Mahatma Gandhi was cremated, is a popular destination for foreign dignitaries. The India Gate, the national monument of India, is located in memory of the 90,000 soldiers of the British-Indian army who fought in World War II. The President House, the official residence of the President of India, is a magnificent Indo-British architectural monument. The Qutub Minar, a 72.5 m high victory stand of Muslim King Kutub-ud-din-Aibak, stands at Lalkote, located 13 km south of Connaught Circus. Overnight stay at the hotel in Delhi



After breakfast, depart from Delhi and drive to Agra, the home of the iconic Taj Mahal. Agra was once the capital of the Mughal Empire, and its rich history is evident in its many forts and palaces. Upon

arrival in Agra, check into your hotel and freshen up. Then, head out to explore the city's many wonders. Your first stop is the Agra Fort, a massive red sandstone fort that was built by Emperor Akbar in the 16th century. The fort is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and is home to a number of palaces, mosques, and gardens. Next, visit the Taj Mahal, one of the Seven Wonders of the World. This white marble mausoleum was built by Shah Jahan in memory of his beloved wife, Mumtaz Mahal. The Taj Mahal is a testament to the Mughal Empire's architectural and artistic prowess. After a long day of sightseeing, return to your hotel and relax; overnight in Agra.

Note: Taj Mahal is closed on every Friday.



After breakfast, drive to Jaipur, also known as the Pink City of Rajasthan. Visit Fatehpur Sikri, a deserted city built by Emperor Akbar in 1569 to celebrate the birth of his son. The city's remains include the Jama Masjid, Buland Darwaza, Tomb of Shaikh Salim Chisti, Place of Jodha Bai, Hawa Mahal, Panch Mahal, Diwan-i-Khas, and Diwan-i-Aam. The city's main entrance is the 54-meter-high Buland Darwaza, built to commemorate Akbar's victory in Gujarat. The Tomb of Shaikh Salim Chisti is a popular tomb for those seeking fulfillment. The Hawa Mahal, a five-story palace, is a blend of Hindu and Muslim architectural styles. The Panch Mahal was Akbar's personal pleasure palace. After visiting Fatehpur Sikri, continue driving to Jaipur. On arrival, check into your hotel and relax. Overnight in Jaipur

In the morning, visit Amber Fort. You can ride an elephant to the top of the fort.

Amber Fort Palace is a beautiful fort palace that was built in the 16th century. It is a mix of Mughal and Hindu architectural styles. The City Palace is a large palace that was built in the 18th century. It is a mix of Mughal and Rajasthani architectural styles. Jantar Mantar is an astronomical observatory that was built in the 18th century. It is one of the five observatories built by Jai Singh II. After visiting these places, you will be transferred to Jaipur airport for your flight onward.

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
